B. Fundamentación Científica.

Los adverbios “**Already**”, “**Yet**”.

<p>Already: ya</p> <p>Se refiere a una acción que ha ocurrido en un tiempo anterior al presente, pero no especificado. Sugiere que no es necesario repetir la acción.</p>	<p>I've already drunk three coffees this morning. (= ¡y me estás ofreciendo otro!)</p> <p>Don't write to John, I've already done it. No le escribas a John, ya lo hice.</p>
<p>También se utiliza para preguntar:</p>	<p>Have you already written to John? ¿Ya le has escrito a John?</p> <p>Has she finished her homework already? ¿Ya ha terminado ella su tarea?</p>

<p>"Already" puede colocarse antes del verbo principal (en "past participle") o al final de la frase.</p>	<p>I have already been to Tokyo. Ya he estado en Tokio.</p> <p>I have been to Tokyo already. Ya he estado en Tokio.</p>
<p>Yet :ya, aún o todavía.</p> <p>Suele colocarse al final de la frase.</p> <p>Se utiliza en oraciones interrogativas y negativas.</p>	<p>Have you met Judy yet? ¿Ya conociste a Judy?</p> <p>Has he arrived yet? ¿Ya ha llegado él?</p> <p>I haven't visited the Gallery yet. (Yo) Todavía no he visitado la Galería.</p> <p>They haven't eaten yet. (ellos) Aún no han comido.</p>
